One day last week, we had 20ish students arrive at school after 7:51 A.M. They hurry into the building hoping they have made it before the bell so that they can head straight to class. When a student doesn't arrive on time, they must check in to the office so that we can correct their attendance. <u>Our teachers take attendance first thing each day and in each class</u>; so, when a student gets marked absent, we need to correct that in the system immediately so parents won't be getting a phone call. That is not always easy to do right away as other issues are also pressing at the beginning of each school day.

My biggest concern, though, is the social and emotional strain coming to school late puts on our students. Walking into class late, missing some instruction, directions, the plan for the day or other important announcements that may be crucial or necessary to the learning and process of the day is generally something a late student misses.

Frankly, we don't have any extra time built into our schedule this year. School starts promptly at 7:51A.M. and our teachers begin their instruction right away. We don't want our students to start their days with anxiety and stress if it can be avoided. I know there are times when being late is unavoidable, but when it happens every day, I think it is important to reevaluate the current plan or habit and how changes can be made to avoid the routine we are in. This is hard, but so important to be sure that our students are in school ready to learn each day.

Truthfully, relieving that unnecessary stress and anxiety could be the start of an amazing day for our students.

Registration

<u>Middle school registration</u> for the 2025-26 school year is now open for current students. At this time, you can also pay all required fees except course fees, which will be assigned in September. Registration is required annually and is the time to update your child's information (phone, email, emergency contacts, health information, etc.). Beginning in 2025-26, all 6th and 9th graders will be required to provide proof of residency (a current purchase contract, lease or utility bill, within the attendance area for your address) as part of the transition to a new level .


BORN TO SOAR
