From the Desk of Ryan Colburn

Tell me if this sounds familiar? You place something on the stairs for your child to put away or they get something out in the kitchen and do not put it away after they are done with it. You ask multiple times for it to be put away or taken to their room and they routinely tell you, "okay", but it never gets done. Days or, sometimes, even weeks go by and the item continues to sit there. Daily activities take place that take good chunks of their time whereas this one task would take seconds to complete and yet, it still doesn't get done!

What do you do?

I think we first have to seek to understand. The easy and sometimes quick reaction is to get angry and demand action from our kids. But, if we take a moment to understand what they are doing and why, we have more knowledge to make informed decisions and, ultimately, help them learn what we expect them to do. For example, consider video games. They are a major part of many of our students' lives. Whether on a gaming platform such as XBOX or Playstation or gaming apps on their phone or computer, video games are a significant part of our kids lives and will be for some time. Understanding how they engage with these games is critical. Someone shared an interesting observation with me a few weeks ago to illustrate this. Some people work to have time to play video games while others play games to determine how much time they have to get work done. Please take a minute to re-read that. If we seek to understand that kids view their lives and the things they need to do as responsibility vs. enjoyment, or as a prioritized list of things that universally we all see as priorities, we gain a better perspective as to why they do the things they do. Honestly, that's really hard. As adults we want our kids to learn/take responsibility for their actions, but if we don't help them understand the "why" behind that, they take no ownership. In turn, that causes potential issues and can lead to misunderstandings and hard feelings.

So, <u>looking at things from others' perspectives can be very valuable and helpful.</u> Even though we want our kids to learn, sometimes we have to give them grace and consistent messages over time to help them learn and process their next steps. In the end, that is when learning takes the largest strides forward.
