## Board approves the 2025-26 Legal Maximum Budget and Estimated Tax Rate

The Board approved the Legal Maximum Budget and Estimated Tax Rate for the 2025-26 school year. The approved budget provides for a 4.0% compensation increase for staff, which aligns with the strategic plan priority of attracting and retaining quality staff. The total estimated mill levy was 53.594 mills. The final mill levy will be determined on November 1 based on final valuation data from Johnson County.
