



Consent to give Over-the-Counter Medications

School personnel must have parental consent in order to administer over-the-counter medications. Generic equivalents maintained in the health room may be used in place of the more expensive brand-name items. The School Nurse or delegated staff person will administer the approved medications as deemed necessary using his/her judgment. If parents send a student's personnel supply of over-the-counter medications to be administered at school, they must be in the original container accompanied by the following signed note from the parent/guardian explaining the reason for the medication.

I understand that any school employee who administers these medications according to proper dosages shall not be held liable for damages as a result of an adverse reaction to the medication administered.
