College Board PSAT NMSQT - PSAT NMSQT testing for sophomore and juniors who opt-in testing at each of the five high schools. The District has roughly 1,200 testers across the five buildings each year. Families pay \$22 per test to Total Registration, of which \$1 goes to Total Registration and \$18 goes to the College Board. The other \$3 helps to offset the building costs in test administration. [NOTE: The price is subject to change; College Board reviews prices in the summer.] (Textbook & Student Materials)

College Board AP Testing – Advanced Placement Testing is paid by parents through Total Registration, who then pays into the account number provided, from which we pay the College Board. The estimated number of testers for 2025–26 is based off the number of testers over previous years. Cost per test is \$110. College Board gets \$88/test (tests cost \$97 each but schools get a \$9.00 rebate per test.) Total Registration collects \$1.86 per test. The District keeps the rest of the fees to help with test administration – including hiring proctors to administer exams and purchase of exam materials. Additionally, it is possible for College Board to increase the price per test (decisions are made each summer). (Textbook & Student Materials)

This process includes career cruising, post-secondary planning, etc. We have maintained this information and process in an on-line tool (Naviance) for many years.
