


I am so excited to get to continue to work with the amazing students, staff, and community members here at OTE!



Raising children is a tough job. This easy-to-use mobile app allows you to check on the school bus whenever you want.

Set up BusZone:

- Download the BusZone app from the App Store or Google Play.
 Enter the above School Access Code.
- In the search field, enter the bus or route number you want to follow.
 Complete this step for all the buses your students ride throughout the week.
- 4. Enter your child's unique student ID.
- 5. Create alert zones around drop-off and pick-up points.

When your child's bus enters an alert zone, you will receive notification by email or text.

Trust that your information is secure.

Security is priority one, especially where student information is concerned. All parent/ guardian information is locked down and password protected within the app to prevent unauthorized people from opening the app and viewing the child's bus information. Have questions? Need more information?

Title I at Overland Trail Elementary

Dear Families.

Overland Trail Elementary School has been identified as an official Title I school, based on the percentage of students who qualify for free or reduced lunch benefits. Title I is a federal program where select schools receive targeted funds to provide additional reading support.

Federal guidelines mandate that Title I schools provide parents with a "right to know." As a parent, you have the right to know information regarding qualifications of your child's classroom teachers. This information can be found at <u>https://appspublic.ksde.org/TLL/SearchLicense.aspx</u>.

As a parent, you also have the right to view both district and building report cards, which can be found by going to <u>www.bluevalleyk12.org</u>, scrolling down to "District Quick Links" and selecting "Accountability Reports." Parents also have the right to request access to students' state assessment scores. These will also be shared via the KITE Parent Portal around the end of the school year.

Weekend Food Pack Program

To help alleviate food insecurity, Community for Kids partners with Overland Trail Elementary to provide one bag of non-perishable food items to participating children each week during the school year. Bag distribution will begin on Thursday, September 5 for families that opt-in by August 18. Families can opt-in throughout

the school year and distribution of the bags will continue weekly. Bags are typically distributed at school each Thursday, except during breaks. Participation is free and optional.

Attendance Message to Parents and Caregivers

Every day Overland Trail Elementary opens its doors to students for a day filled with learning. When a student does not arrive at school or unexpectedly misses a portion of the school day, we are concerned and want to ensure you know that your child is absent.

Beginning Thursday, August 15, families will be notified of unexpected absences through email, phone, text, and optional push notifications. Overland Trail Elementary families can expect automated attendance messages by email, phone, and text at 9:35 AM. if a child is absent and his/her absence has not already been reported by a parent/guardian. The parent or caregiver must call the school to report an absence or reply to the automated email or phone message. Families who would also like a push notification can download the ParentVUE app and manage their notifications. A push notification will immediately be sent to the parent or caregiver's mobile device if a child has an unreported absence when a teacher submits attendance.

Families who would also like a push notification can download the ParentVUE app and manage their notifications. If a child has an unreported absence when a teacher submits attendance, then a push notification will immediately be sent to the parent/guardian's mobile device.

Attendance Procedures

If your child will miss school, please call the Overland Trail Elementary attendance line at 913-239-7005 or email the attendance line at <u>attendanceOTE@bluevalleyk12.org</u>.

Please include your child's name (first and last), grade level, classroom teacher, and reason for the absence. If leaving a message, please make sure you speak slowly and clearly. It is always helpful to repeat the information as well. The Blue Valley School District has amended the district's attendance policy (Board Policy 3200). **Students will be permitted** *seven* excused absences during the school year for family emergencies, vacations, and personal business. Send a note to the teacher and the office if your child is on vacation. Separate letters should be written for each child.

Attendance Reporting and Notifications

Families can expect automated attendance messages by email and text if a child is absent and their absence has not already been reported by a parent/guardian. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to report an absence or reply to the automated phone message.

What is the purpose of attendance notifications?

We realize that students may occasionally need to miss school for planned absences, illnesses, and appointments. However, when a student does not arrive at school or unexpectedly misses a portion of the school day, we are concerned and want to ensure you know your child is absent.

How can I get push notifications?

Families who would also like a push notification can download the ParentVUE app and manage their notifications. A push notification will immediately be sent to the parent/guardian's mobile device if a child has an unreported absence when a teacher submits attendance.

Are you interested in push notifications? Download the ParentVUE app (<u>iTunes app store</u> or <u>Google</u> <u>Play</u>), enable push notifications in device settings, and select attendance notifications through inapp settings. Once the app is downloaded, <u>these instructions</u> will help you complete the setup.



Boundary Adjustments

Board approves boundary adjustments for 2024-25 school year At the June 12 Board of Education meeting, the board approved the 2022-23 Facility Planning Committee's report, including boundary adjustments that address elementary school enrollment and building capacity issues. The approved boundary adjustments impact several schools to keep contiguous attendance areas.

Boundary adjustments approved for the 2024-25 school year include:

- Deer Creek boundaries will be adjusted to attend Overland Trail Elementary.
- Sandstone Creek, Savoy, and Plaza Gardens boundaries will be adjusted to attend Harmony Elementary. This adjustment will also include a change in feeder pattern to Harmony Middle and Blue Valley Northwest.
- Glen Abbey & Villas of Chapel Green and Highland Villas and Highlands Creek boundaries will be adjusted to attend Prairie Star Elementary. This adjustment will also include a change in feeder pattern to Prairie Star Middle and Blue Valley High.

The committee's work, including documents, maps, and presentations, can be found on the <u>district's website</u>.

Arrival and Dismissal Procedures

Arrival Procedures:

- 1. Our school doors open at 8:25 AM. Children should not arrive before 8:25 AM.
- 2. School begins at 8:40 AM. After 8:40 AM, students are considered tardy. A parent or guardian must come to the school's front entrance with their photo id to have their child signed in if they arrive at school later than 8:40 AM.
- 3. The crosswalk will be closed starting at 8:25 AM. If your student needs extra assistance, park in the parking lot closest to the playground. Do not park in the main parking lot.
- 4. Students should remain buckled in their seats until the vehicle stops in the traffic loop.
- 5. Cell phones should not be used while in the traffic loop.
- 6. Drivers in the car line will need to always drive completely to the front to ensure the car line is a fluid and efficient process for student arrival. Vehicles in the traffic loop will have the right of way and will be given priority over families walking or going to the parking lot.

Dismissal Procedures:

- 1. Dismissal begins at 3:35 PM. Our goal is to complete dismissal by 4:00 PM.
- 2. Students who walk home will exit the building through the exit doors on the North side of the building.
- 3. Students who walk home cannot stay on the OTE campus. Y-Care utilizes the building and playground after school, Monday-Friday.
- 4. Car line drivers may not be in the car line sooner than 3:00 PM to avoid conflicting with the middle school traffic.

Safety Expectations | Food Deliveries

- Food delivery services disrupt the learning environment and pose a potential security concern. Various doors have been utilized, and most delivery service providers have unfamiliar faces that are challenging to verify.
- We will not accept meals delivered by paid delivery services during the school day for students. These deliveries will be refused.



General Reminder for Visitors During the School Day

Our office staff wants to share a general reminder that all elementary schools in the district utilize the buzz-in entry system for visitors during the school day. Visitors will need to come to the front of the school. At the front entrance, visitors will press the buzzer, show government-issued photo identification, and state the purpose of their visit each time they visit the school. **If you**

arrive without identification, the office will seek the administration's approval for entry.

We ask that guests not hold the door open for another visitor once they have been buzzed in. Instead, allow the door to close for visitors to go through the above-mentioned procedures. We appreciate the support of our safety procedures.

Overland Trail Elementary will open for visitors after Labor Day beginning Wednesday, September 4, 2024.

Personal Devices

To provide the most effective learning spaces possible, the following guidelines concerning personal cell phones (CP) and associated personal technology devices (PTD) at the elementary school level are in effect. Cell phones and personal technological

devices are any devices designed for personal communication, digital information transfer, or electronic gaming/play.

Cell phones and personal technology devices are not allowed to be used by elementary school students during the school day. The school day is defined as anytime the student is on campus property on a day school is in session. CP/PTDs are to be silenced stowed away at all times. Should the need arise for a student to contact parents during the school day, the main office phone or the classroom phone should be used for such a call. Should the need arise for parents to contact their child, the main office phone should be used for such a call. CP/PTDs may be used by the student only at the request of the classroom teacher or other staff member. CP/PTDs used to monitor identified student health needs, such as blood sugar levels, are allowed and must be approved by the principal.

Grades 3-12 | Grade Opt-In Option for Securly Filter

Parents and caregivers can now choose to place their 3-12th grade students in the High Restrictions Filter Group for their district-issued device by signing up<u>here</u>. The link details the differences between the Default and High Restrictions Policies.

Birthday Policy

Due to the growing number of food allergies and medical needs of students, OTE has a **non-edible** treat policy. Students may bring non-edible birthday treats (e.g., pencils, stickers, etc.) per arrangement with the classroom teacher. Remember that a birthday celebration should not take away from instructional time.

Birthday Invitations: We ask that students not distribute invitations to private birthday parties at school unless every class member receives an invitation.



Nut-Safer Guidelines

At OTE, we have a wide variety of food allergens and restrictions. To remain safe and to prevent exclusion, we don't accept food, including items from the Nut-Safe List, to serve in school or send home with students for birthday celebrations. This complies with our **non-edible birthday celebration.** Essentially, we must remember that sending food home is a risk for children as they transition between school and home, putting our families in an

undesirable position when they cannot eat what is provided.

Blue Valley (BV) School's Nut Safer Guidelines for daily snacks will be implemented throughout the school year.

· Classroom snacks must be from the Nut Safer list.

· Nut Safer seating is available in the café during lunch.
