Dear Families,

We look forward to welcoming each of you to our
 Book Fair Family Night this coming Tuesday, which will be combined with our
 Conscious Discipline Family Night. Our Conscious Discipline Family Night will provide a unique approach to discipline, presented by Tabatha Rosproy, former Kansas Teacher of the Year. Please use this <u>link</u> to RSVP to the Conscious Discipline Family Night.

Please be mindful of this very important safety reminder. Periodically, OTE students are dropped off at school in the morning before the doors are unlocked or staff is present to welcome them. We believe this is an unsafe practice and ask parents to wait to drop off their children until our adult staff is on duty at 8:25 AM to provide supervision. I appreciate your cooperation.

The carline procedures have been methodically instituted with the help of the city, Overland Park Police Department, and Blue Valley Safety and Security. The carline may not be ideal for families, but it is a system created to ensure efficiency and pedestrian safety. We are seeing an increase in carline practices that should be corrected. Please read below regarding the specifics of arrival and dismissal.

Arrival

The carline begins to move at 8:25 when the doors open for students to enter the building. At this time, it is expected that car riders will be in the carline and traffic flow will continue consistently and efficiently without the disruption of pedestrians interfering with traffic. Both crosswalks at the front entrance are closed to pedestrians beginning at 8:25. If you would like to drive to the school and walk your child to the entrance, you will need to arrive before 8:25, and park in the lot south of

the building and walk your child along the sidewalk to the front of the building. Lastly, drivers and adult passengers must stay in their vehicle to support a student's exit from the car. Staff will provide support to sustain carline safety and efficiency.

Dismissal

The carline for OTE begins at 3:15. If you arrive before this time, you must park in the parking lot south of OTE to avoid disturbing the middle school dismissal traffic. If you would like to drive to OTE and walk to get your child, you will have to be in the south parking lot by 3:15, or your car rider will have to be dismissed by the carline, as it is intended for car riders. If you would rather your child be a walker, you may avoid the carline altogether by changing their dismissal to a walker and walking to pickup through the walker doors on the west side of the building.

OTE is a rather largely populated school, so the arrival and dismissal process will take some time to ensure every student is safely accounted for during these times. We understand the carline is extended; however, to clear the main road efficiently and effectively, we must adhere to the carline procedures and avoid alternatives that strain staff, students, and carline drivers who adhere to the policies in place. We appreciate your attention to following the staff, student, and family safety guidelines.







On July 1, 2023, the Every Child Can Read Act went into effect in Kansas. The intent of this legislation was to address literacy initiatives with a target of ensuring students reach grade level benchmarks by third grade. In Blue Valley, we prioritize partnership with families in conjunction with high quality, evidence-based instruction rooted in the science of reading. This has been and remains a large area of focus for professional learning. Rather than limit conversations about reading progress to 3rd grade, it is our practice to do so at each grade level. On Thursday, October 31, we will have our school-wide Halloween celebration. We are excited to welcome our families to the school parade, but due to space constraints, we will only have room parents and three volunteers per class to enter the building to facilitate class parties. <u>Additionally</u>, <u>we discourage siblings who do not attend OTE to attend</u>. Please look forward to communication from your room parents soon providing more details about volunteering for this year's class celebrations.

Food

Provided food will need to come from our district-approved <u>Nut-Safer Guide</u>. Please refrain from bringing homemade items for class celebrations. Additionally, goodie bags will need to be non-edible. Any edible goodie bags received will be returned.

Costumes

All students look forward to the Halloween Celebration; we have specific guidelines for these parties.

- 1. At classroom parties where costumes may be worn, violent or gory costumes are unacceptable.
- 2. Costumes should not take away from instructional time. If a costume distracts self and others, the student will be asked to go to the nurse to change.
- 3. No costume "weapons" or look-alike weapons may be brought to school, e.g., light sabers, swords, or toy guns.
- 4. Costumes will be worn to school and should not depict violence or gore.
- 5. Students should have costumes that do not require time-consuming assistance with makeup, dressing, etc. Also, masks and face paint should not be worn or brought to school.
- 6. Costumes must respect the Blue Valley dress code policy BOE policy 3513.

Halloween Parade and Celebration

1:45 PM: Room Parents Enter and Parade Prep

• Room parents and three volunteers for each class will be invited to begin setting up for the class party and supporting costume adjustments. Please look forward to communication from room parents, who will facilitate communication with families to gather volunteers for this year's celebrations.

2:15 PM: Parade

• We will have a school-wide parade that includes the fifth grade leading all grade levels out the bus-cut doors, walking on the west side of the Early Childhood playground, and circling the track counterclockwise before entering the exterior gym doors. Families are invited to watch the parade from the field.

2:30 PM: Monster Mash

• Teachers will guide students into the gym for the Monster Mash, a short sing and dance-along led by specialists. When the Monster Mash concludes, students return to class for the class

2:55 PM-3:25 PM: Class Celebration

• The class celebration will consist of one game **or** craft and treats. Only room parents and their volunteers can attend the class celebration. Room parents and volunteers will submit dismissal changes through PUP if they apply. In addition, you will need to sign out on the provided sign-out sheet in the room you are supporting.

Nut-Safer Guidelines

At OTE, we have a wide variety of food allergens and restrictions. To remain safe and to prevent exclusion, we don't accept food, including items from the Nut-Safe List, to serve in school or send home with students for birthday celebrations. This complies with our **non-edible birthday celebration**. Essentially, we must remember that sending food home is a risk for children as they transition between school and home, putting our families in an undesirable position when they cannot eat what is provided.

Blue Valley (BV) School's Nut Safer Guidelines for daily snacks will be implemented throughout the school year.

- \cdot Classroom snacks must be from the Nut Safer list.
- \cdot Nut Safer seating is available in the café during lunch.

We appreciate your support as we work to be more preventative with food safety measures to enhance student and staff safety.
