Arrival & Dismissal Reminders

Our arrival and dismissal routines were thoughtfully designed in partnership with the Overland Park Police Department to ensure safety and efficiency for all. While it may sometimes feel convenient to take shortcuts, doing so can create safety concerns and disrupt the flow of dismissal. We kindly ask that you help us maintain a safe and productive process by following these expectations:

Car Line

- To enable a more efficient drop off and pick up process, all vehicles must pull up to the furthest point.
- Drivers must stay in their vehicle. All students must enter from the passenger side.


Walkers

- Students and adults are not permitted to use the crosswalk without a crossing guard. For any individual transitioning on foot during school hours, you must cross the street at the roundabout and with the support of the crossing guard.
- If you would like to walk your child to and away from the front entrance for arrival or dismissal, please park in the south parking lot and use the sidewalk leading to the main entrance. For safety reasons, families may not park in the east lot and cross at the crosswalk through the car line.

Fever & Vomit Blue Valley Policy Reminder

As a reminder as we begin the new school year, students who have had a fever, vomited or had diarrhea at home must remain out of school for a <u>full 24 hours</u> without the use of fever-reducing medications. If your student develops a fever, vomits or has diarrhea during the school day, you will be contacted to pick up your student. This policy is in place to help prevent the spread of illness to other students in our school. Thank you for helping to keep our OTE community healthy!

Room Parents & Classroom Celebrations

We've made some exciting updates to improve clarity, consistency, and ease for Room Parents and families:

- New Donation Process: All classroom celebration funds will now be collected online through
 the PTO website by grade level, rather than through individual Room Parents. This provides
 greater transparency and consistency, automatic receipts for families, an audit trail for
 accountability, and relief from the awkwardness of sending money to personal Venmo
 accounts.
- Room Parents No Longer Handle Money: You can focus on building community and helping in the classroom—we'll handle the funds!
- **Celebration Consistency:** All snacks and activities will be pre-planned and consistent across each grade. The PTO will purchase materials in bulk and distribute them to classrooms.
- Streamlined Room Parent Sign-Ups: Families will sign up via the PTO website. <u>Sign-ups are live on the PTO website</u> and are first-come, first-served. Each class will be limited to two Room Parents.


Securly Home: Partnering for Your Child's Online Safety

Securly is the leading solution in keeping children safe online at school. Now parents can get the same peace of mind when school devices come home. See your child's online activity in real-time and catch up with our weekly email snapshots.

Eligibility: Only for parents listed as "Lives With & Edu Rights" in Synergy.

Take an active role in your child's digital safety with Securly Home, the district's cloud-based filtering system.

Key Features



- Monitor & Customize Filters: Use the Securly Home Parent Portal app (<u>Apple App Store</u> or <u>Google Play</u>) to monitor and adjust filters on district devices used outside the BV Network. Available for families with district-issued Chromebooks/MacBooks.
- Self-Harm Alerts: Receive mobile push notifications if your child searches self-harm content on district devices.
- Pause Internet Access: Temporarily disable internet access on your child's district device outside the school network.
- Weekly Activity Reports: Get weekly email summaries of your child's online activity (reports show all online activity after they leave the school network. Unsubscribe anytime.

Setup Tips

- Accounts are linked to the email in "email line #1" in ParentVUE.
- Need help updating your email in ParentVUE? Contact your school's front office.
- For setup support, submit a BV Care ticket via the BVSD website.

Note: Parent Custom Filters apply only when devices are not connected to the BV Network. Once reconnected, district filters resume.

Visitors During the School Day



As a reminder, all elementary schools in the district—including Overland Trail Elementary—utilize a **buzz-in entry system** for all visitors during the school day to help maintain a safe and secure environment.

When visiting the school, please come to the **main entrance** and press the buzzer. You will be asked to:

- 1. Show a government-issued photo ID
- 2. State the purpose of your visit

This process is required **each time** you visit the school. If you arrive without identification, the office will need to seek administrative approval before allowing entry.

For security reasons, we kindly ask that all guests **refrain from holding the door open for others**. Each visitor should go through the buzz-in process individually to ensure proper screening.

Birthday Policy

Due to the growing number of food allergies and medical needs of students, OTE has a **non-edible** treat policy. Students may bring non-edible birthday treats (e.g., pencils, stickers, etc.) per arrangement with the classroom teacher. Remember that a birthday celebration should not take away from instructional time.

Birthday Invitations: We ask that students not distribute invitations to private birthday parties at school unless every class member receives an invitation.

Nut-Safer Guidelines



At OTE, we have a wide variety of food allergens and restrictions. To remain safe and to prevent exclusion, we don't accept food, including items from the Nut-Safe List, to serve in school or send home with students for birthday celebrations. This complies with our **non-edible birthday celebration**. Essentially, we must remember that sending food home is a risk for children as they transition between school and home, putting our families in an undesirable position when they cannot eat what is provided.

Blue Valley (BV) School's Nut Safer Guidelines for daily snacks will be implemented throughout the school year.

- · Classroom snacks must be from the Nut Safer list.
- · Nut Safer seating is available in the café during lunch.

We appreciate your support as we work to be more preventative with food safety measures to enhance student and staff safety.
