Some February Celebrations & Observances:

- Black History Month created to celebrate the achievements, contributions, and rich cultural heritages of African Americans. Black History Month highlights the triumphs and adversities that have helped shape the United States.
- World Hijab Day February 1 this day recognizes the millions of Muslim women who choose to wear the hijab. Inviting women of all identities to wear the hijab for one day, it promotes understanding of other cultures and personal freedoms of religious expression.
- Lunar New Year February 10 celebrated by families of Chinese and other Asian heritages, some people celebrate with religious ceremonies honoring ancestors, giving and receiving red envelopes containing small amounts of money, lighting colorful lanterns, and eating traditional foods such as dumplings and sticky rice balls that symbolize family unity.
- Ash Wednesday February 14 a Christian holiday signifying the first day of the Lenten season, the 40 days (excluding Sundays) leading to Easter. Some families will attend religious services and receive ashes in the shape of a cross on their forehead.
- Magha Puja Day February 24 an important Buddhist festival celebrating the gathering between Buddha and his first disciples. Some families will attend temple, meditate, listen to teachings, perform giving alms, and hold candlelight processions.

Blue Valley families,

This winter has brought an unprecedented number of inclement weather days — eight so far — exceeding the five built into our 2024-25 school calendar. While keeping our students and staff safe remains our top priority, we must also ensure we meet the state's required instructional time. To put our district in the best position to meet these requirements and maintain our long-standing goal of ending the school year by Memorial Day, we are making the following adjustments:

- Friday, Feb. 28 The scheduled elementary teacher professional collaboration day will now be a school day.
- Early March high school late start changes There will be no late start on March 4, 6, 11 or 13. School will begin at the normal time on those dates.

• Friday, April 25 – The scheduled professional learning day will now be a school day for all students.

We recognize that changes to the calendar present challenges for students, families, and staff alike, and we appreciate your flexibility as we navigate these adjustments. Our focus remains on keeping students learning while meeting state requirements.

While these changes address our current situation, we will announce the last day of school after Spring Break when most winter weather events have passed, allowing for a clearer decision. Thank you for your understanding and partnership as we work through this challenging winter together.

Kindergarten Registration | 2025-2026

Dear Families,

Kindergarten registration for the 2025-2026 school year is now open.

To read this message in a language other than English<u>, click here.</u> We are excited to welcome your new kindergarten student for the 2025-26 school year. Please review and complete the steps below. Your timely registration will ensure our team is prepared. In a future message, we will send more information about Kindergarten Kick-Off (formerly known as Kindergarten Round-Up).

Step 1: Please watch this school welcome here.

Step 2: Do you have questions about kindergarten programs in Blue Valley? (Click on the blue links below)

- What do kindergarten students experience during a typical day?
- How can I learn about the Chinese immersion option?

Step 3: Is there another language spoken in your home?

If so, please complete this <u>form</u>. Otherwise, move to step 4. Note: If your family speaks English *in addition* to another language, you will still need to complete the form.

Step 4: How do I register my child?

To view registration instructions in a language other than English, <u>click here</u>.

To begin the registration process for the 2025-26 school year, simply go to <u>www.bluevalleyk12.org/registration</u> and click **New Student Registration** in the Useful Links. Families new to Blue Valley will be asked to create an online parent account. Online registration will take approximately 20 minutes to complete, and it is an important step in getting your student started in kindergarten! You will be asked to pay fees later this spring.

Please note: If your child is currently enrolled in the Blue Valley early childhood program, you will not complete online registration at this time. Families transitioning from early childhood to kindergarten will be able to verify the information and complete the registration process later this spring.

To make Blue Valley's Online Registration process smooth and convenient, please have the following information available:

- Student proof of identity (birth certificate)
- Emergency contact name(s) and phone number(s)
- Doctor, dentist, and preferred hospital contact info
- Immunization record and health assessment (physical)
- Proof of residency (purchase contract, lease, or current utility bill)
- Custodial documentation (if applicable)
- Previous school records and contact info
- IEP or 504 Plan (if applicable)

Tip: As soon as your child's registration is complete, you will receive all school communication items that will help welcome you and your family into the school community.

Growth and Development | Grade 4 & 5 | Thursday, March 13

Dear OTE Families:

The growth seen during the elementary years can be an exciting time in health education. The Blue Valley Health Curriculum was written by a committee of Blue Valley teachers, nurses, and counselors to educate our students about health-related issues. The curriculum was reviewed by the Curriculum and Instruction Committee (which includes parents, board of education members and faculty members) prior to being approved by the Blue Valley Board of Education. It is based on the National and Kansas Health standards. The purpose of the curriculum is to develop positive attitudes toward health and wellness among our students. The curriculum learning standards can be found at Blue Valley Website (<u>http://www.bluevalleyk12.org/</u>) and select Academics – Elementary School – Curriculum - Health.

The content taught in 4th and 5th grade focuses on the topic of human growth and development.

These topics are introduced at age-appropriate levels of understanding. The identification of male and female reproductive parts and functions are part of the intermediate curriculum in grades 4 and 5. This content will be presented separately by both grade and gender. During instruction students are always encouraged to talk with their families about concepts learned in health. The Growth and Development curriculum will be taught on **Thursday, March 13th, 2025**. You are welcome to contact Nurse Jenn to review the district approved instructional materials that will be presented. If for any reason you choose *not* to have your student participate in the session, please email Nurse Jenn at <u>JAArnoldColeman@bluevalleyk12.org</u> to opt-out.

Teacher Collaboration Days

As we kick off the 2024-25 school year, I want to remind families about the teacher professional collaboration days designed for teacher plan and collaboration time. These eight days, which occur throughout the school year, are non-student attendance days for K-5 students. These days are vital to ensure the best possible preparation for our elementary students and key to quality teacher retention.

Reminder: November 1st is a K-5 non-student attendance day for teacher collaboration time. During this time, elementary educators will be in their buildings and classrooms working to ensure the best possible preparation for our elementary students and supporting student learning outcomes.

Nut-Safer Guidelines

At OTE, we have a wide variety of food allergens and restrictions. To remain safe and to prevent exclusion, we don't accept food, including items from the Nut-Safe List, to serve in school or send



home with students for birthday celebrations. This complies with our **non-edible birthday celebration.** Essentially, we must remember that sending food home is a risk for children as they transition between school and home, putting our families in an undesirable position when they cannot eat what is provided.

Blue Valley (BV) School's Nut Safer Guidelines for daily snacks will be implemented throughout the school year.

 \cdot Classroom snacks must be from the Nut Safer list.

· Nut Safer seating is available in the café during lunch.
