

Community Celebrations and Observance - to promote awareness and appreciation of our Blue Valley families.

Some March Celebrations & Observances:

- The Nineteen-Day Fast March 1-19 a time of prayer, meditation, and fasting; some adult members of the Bahá'í faith refrain from food and water from sunrise to sunset each day. This practice might include prayers of spiritual preparation for the new year.
- Ramadan evening of March 1-30 the holy month of fasting for the Islamic faith. For some Muslim families, it is a time for introspection, communal prayer, reading the Qur'an, and fasting between sunrise and sunset.
- Ash Wednesday March 5 a Christian holiday signifying the first day of the Lenten season, the 40 days (excluding Sundays) leading to Easter. Some families will attend religious services and receive ashes in the shape of a cross on their forehead.
- **Holi** March 14 known as the Hindu festival of colors, Holi honors the triumph of good over evil and marks the beginning of Spring. Some families will light bonfires, throw colorful powder called *gulal*, eat sweets, and dance to traditional music.
- Eid al Fitr March 31 marks the end of Ramadan, the Muslim holy month
 of fasting. Some families will celebrate the "Festival of Breaking the Fast" by
 joining in communal prayer and meals, visiting family, gift-giving, and
 charity.

Kindergarten registration for the 2025-2026 school year is now open.

We are excited to welcome your new kindergarten student for the 2025-26 school year. Please review and complete the steps below. Your timely registration will ensure our team is prepared. In a future message, we will send more information about Kindergarten Kick-Off (formerly known as Kindergarten Round-Up).

Step 1: Please watch this school welcome here.

Step 2: Do you have questions about kindergarten programs in Blue Valley? (Click on the blue links below)

- What do kindergarten students experience during a typical day?
- How can I learn about the **Chinese immersion** option?

Step 3: Is there another language spoken in your home?

If so, please complete this **form**. Otherwise, move to step 4.

Note: If your family speaks English *in addition* to another language, you will still need to complete the form.

Step 4: How do I register my child?

To view registration instructions in a language other than English, click here.

To begin the registration process for the 2025-26 school year, simply go to www.bluevalleyk12.org/registration and click **New Student Registration** in the Useful Links. Families new to Blue Valley will be asked to create an online parent account. Online registration will take approximately 20 minutes to complete, and it is an important step in getting your student started in kindergarten! You will be asked to pay fees later this spring.

Please note: If your child is currently enrolled in the Blue Valley early childhood program, you will not complete online registration at this time. Families transitioning from early childhood to kindergarten will be able to verify the information and complete the registration process later this spring.

To make Blue Valley's Online Registration process smooth and convenient, please have the following information available:

- Student proof of identity (birth certificate)
- Emergency contact name(s) and phone number(s)
- Doctor, dentist, and preferred hospital contact info
- Immunization record and health assessment (physical)
- Proof of residency (purchase contract, lease, or current utility bill)
- Custodial documentation (if applicable)
- · Previous school records and contact info
- IEP or 504 Plan (if applicable)

Tip: As soon as your child's registration is complete, you will receive all school communication items that will help welcome you and your family into the school community.

Growth and Development | Grade 4 & 5 | Thursday, March 13

Dear OTE Families:

The growth seen during the elementary years can be an exciting time in health education. The Blue Valley Health Curriculum was written by a committee of Blue Valley teachers, nurses, and counselors to educate our students about health-related issues. The curriculum was reviewed by the Curriculum and Instruction Committee (which includes parents, board of education members and faculty members) prior to being approved by the Blue Valley Board of Education. It is based on the National and Kansas Health standards. The purpose of the curriculum is to develop positive attitudes toward health and wellness among our students. The curriculum learning standards can be found at Blue Valley Website (http://www.bluevalleyk12.org/) and select Academics — Elementary School — Curriculum - Health.

The content taught in 4th and 5th grade focuses on the topic of human growth and development.

These topics are introduced at age-appropriate levels of understanding. The identification of male and female reproductive parts and functions are part of the intermediate curriculum in grades 4 and 5. This content will be presented separately by both grade and gender. During instruction students are always encouraged to talk with their families about concepts learned in health.

The Growth and Development curriculum will be taught on **Thursday, March 13th, 2025**. You are welcome to contact Nurse Jenn to review the district approved instructional materials that will be presented. If for any reason you choose *not* to have your student participate in the session, please email Nurse Jenn at <u>JAArnoldColeman@bluevalleyk12.org</u> to opt-out.

Nut Safer List 24-25

At OTE, we have a wide variety of food allergens and restrictions. To remain safe and to prevent exclusion, we don't accept food, including items from the Nut-Safe List, to serve in school or send home with students for birthday celebrations. This complies with our **non-edible birthday celebration**. Essentially, we must remember that sending food home is a risk for children as they transition between school and home, putting our families in an undesirable position when they cannot eat what is provided.

Blue Valley (BV) School's Nut Safer Guidelines for daily snacks will be implemented throughout the school year.

- · Nut Safer seating is available in the café during lunch.

· Classroom snacks must be from the Nut Safer list.

We appreciate your support as we work to be more preventative with food safety measures to enhance student and staff safety.
