#### **Classroom Parties**

The classrooms are too crowded to accommodate extra bodies on party days, and we want the focus to be on our elementary-aged students. 
- Any PSE family may invite Veterans who have served or continue to serve in the US military. Please fill out the RSVP link with the Veteran's information.

# Mycoplasma Pneumonia Facts

- \*\* A frequent cause of respiratory infections, including community-acquired pneumonia, in school-age children and young adults.
- \*\* Transmitted from person to person via respiratory droplets during close contact.
- Disease onset is gradual, with initial complaints of headaches, malaise, and low-grade fever. A nagging cough is usually the most prominent respiratory feature. Chest soreness from coughing is common. Wheezing can also occur. Other respiratory symptoms include pharyngitis, rhinorrhea, and ear pain.
- Macrolides are generally considered the treatment of choice for young children.

  Resistance to macrolides emerged in M. pneumoniae in the early 2000s please remember to complete the full course of treatment to prevent antibiotic resistance!



# Join us for "Trunk or Treat" on WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 30th!


