

Seven Days of Kindness



Social Thinking with Mrs. Furdek

For the past two weeks, our students have been learning about Space Invader and Space Base. Space Invader is the unthinkabot that invades others' space, and it can make us feel uncomfortable. We discussed that our comfort level with others invading our space can vary. Students came up with a list of individuals we allow in a smaller comfort bubble (family members, siblings, close friends, doctors, dentists, teachers, etc).

Space Base is the Thinkable that pairs with Space Invader. We must activate our Space Base thinking to help create space for others. Space Base helps all of us measure the place to figure out the space. Another tool Space Base helps with is the One- Arm Rule in standing with a group of people. Finally, Space Base also helps us be social detectives when we are in a space with others. The example given to students was if you are standing too close to an individual and they step away they are asking for space in a non-verbal way.

Next week 3rd-5th will be learning about Mean Bean and Nice Light.

Families transitioning from early childhood to kindergarten will have an opportunity to verify the information and complete the registration process later this spring.

To make Blue Valley's Online Registration process smooth and convenient, please have the following information available:

- Student proof of identity (birth certificate)
- Emergency contact name(s) and phone number(s)
- Doctor, dentist and preferred hospital contact info
- Immunization record and health assessment (physical)
- Proof of residency (purchase contract, lease or current utility bill)
- Custodial documentation (if applicable)
- Previous school records and contact info
- IEP or 504 Plan (if applicable)

Tip: As soon as your child's registration is complete, you will begin receiving all-school communication items that will help welcomeyou and your family into the school community.




5th Grade Farewell @ 9:00



Partnering for a Safe School Community

Ensuring our students' and staff's safety and well-being remains our highest priority. As we near the end of the school year, we want to take a moment to thank our families for their partnership. Your support and conversations at home have made a meaningful impact on student behaviors, reinforcing the importance of making good choices and reporting concerns appropriately. How We Address Threats

We take every report of a threat seriously-whether that threat is made on social media, in person or through another means. Our administrators work closely with our Safety and Security team and local law enforcement to investigate each case thoroughly. This process includes reviewing past behavior, gathering input from families, and conducting interviews. If a credible threat is identified, we will immediately notify staff and families. You can learn more about our safety protocols and threat assessment process on our <u>district website</u>.

Partnering to Keep Schools Safe

This spring, we will continue our informational graphics through Canvas for grades 6-12 about the real consequences of making threats. Even offhand comments or social media posts can have serious repercussions, including school disciplinary action or legal consequences. It's important for students to think before they post or speak.

We encourage families to listen to our fall 2024 <u>BV Unmuted podcast episode: Understanding</u> <u>Threats and Their Consequences</u>. In this episode, former Interim Chief Simon Happer (Overland Park Police Department), Dan Carney (Director of Safety & Security), and Dr. Katie Collier (Deputy Superintendent for Learning) discuss how Blue Valley ensures a safe and secure learning environment.

- Report Concerns: Please remind your student to report any concerning behavior to school staff or use our <u>online reporting system</u>.
- Avoid Spreading Rumors: Social media can spread misinformation and create unnecessary anxiety. Instead of sharing posts, report them directly to school administrators or law enforcement with as much detail as possible.
