Spring Testing Day - April 8th

9th-11th Grade Parents <u>please review this chart regarding testing plan for the day.</u> Also, students will be dismissed from their testing locations from 11:30-11:45. PM buses will run students home at this time. We will not be serving lunch that day.

Attendance Matters: In-Class Learning Can't Be Replaced

Last day announced for 2024-25 school year

With the fourth quarter underway, the district has determined the last day of the 2024-25 school year for students. Assuming no unforeseen circumstances cause us to cancel school, the last day for students in grades K-11 will be May 23. Students in the early childhood programs will have their last day on May 22. High school finals will occur May 21-23, with building principals communicating the specific schedules to their school families and students at a later date. AP Exams: May 5-16

Parents of Incoming 11th Grade Students:

Please be aware that you will be receiving communication in the mail soon from BVNW Nurse regarding your student's immunizations. The state of Kansas requires all 11th grade students to receive a dose of MCV4 (meningococcal) vaccine to prevent against Meningitis, a potentially fatal brain and spinal cord infection. All students must receive <u>after</u> their 16th birthday. Please have your

student receive this required vaccination before the start of their 11th grade year, beginning on August 13th, 2025. If their 16th birthday falls after this date, please note the altered exclusion date on the communication from the school nurse.

Alternative options to vaccination are detailed in the mailed communication you will be receiving soon. If we have already been notified that your student has had this vaccination, you will not receive any communication in the mail or by email. 


Message from the Activities Department

Community Celebrations and Observances - to promote awareness and appreciation of our Blue Valley families.

• The Nineteen Day Fast - March 1-19 - a time of prayer, meditation, and fasting, some adult members of the Bahá'í faith refrain from food and water from sunrise to sunset each day. This practice might include prayers of spiritual preparation for the new year.



- Ramadan evening of March 1-30 the holy month of fasting for the Islamic faith. For some Muslim families, it is a time for introspection, communal prayer, reading the Qur'an, and fasting between sunrise and sunset.
- **Ash Wednesday** March 5 a Christian holiday signifying the first day of the Lenten season, the 40 days (excluding Sundays) leading to Easter. Some families will attend religious services and receive ashes in the shape of a cross on their forehead.
- **Holi** March 14 known as the Hindu festival of colors, Holi honors the triumph of good over evil and marks the beginning of Spring. Some families will light bonfires, throw colorful powder called *gulal*, eat sweets, and dance to traditional music.
- **Eid al Fitr** March 31 marks the end of Ramadan, the Muslim holy month of fasting. Some families will celebrate the "Festival of Breaking the Fast" by joining in communal prayer and meals, visiting family, gift-giving, and charity.

With the nicer weather, if your student walks to school, please remind them to use the designated crosswalks and to put their phone down and be aware of their surroundings when crossing the street. We also ask all drivers to drive with caution, with phones down and aware of walkers, as they navigate the roads and parking lots around our school.
